Donor Allocation Policy:

- You may allocate up to 100% of your total gift within the United Way network, including the Community Solutions Fund, Local Impact Areas, United Way Partner Agencies, other United Ways, and member agencies of our neighboring United Ways (including Butler, Champaign, Clark, Clinton, Darke, Fayette, Madison, Miami and Warren Counties in Ohio, and Wayne County in Indiana).
- You may allocate up to 50% of your total gift to any 501(c)3 organization that provides a health or human service program in our region.

Designations:

- A \$24 minimum applies to all designations. Because it is too costly to track and distribute smaller donations, any designations less than \$24 will automatically be transferred to the Community Solutions Fund.
- If clarifications or changes to your designations are required to properly process your pledge, United Way will make two attempts to contact you. If we do not receive a response, designations will automatically be transferred to the Community Solutions Fund.
- Designations made outside the United Way network exceeding 50% of your total gift will be reduced to 50%; the remainder will be transferred to the Community Solutions Fund.

Leadership Giving:

Donors who pledge \$1,000 or more will be automatically recognized as members of United Way's Leadership Circle.
